## ***Our Philosophy***

Every child is a unique person in his/her own right, so we will meet the individual needs of each and every child.

We believe that each day your child spends at school should be filled with joy, wonder, fun, and the excitement that comes from learning new things and sharing new experiences. This is our daily mission.

Your child deserves an environment that invites exploring, discovery, fun, and play. For us, this means classrooms filled with materials that encourage your child's positive growth in all areas.

Your child deserves an environment that serves to help him/her fulfill his/her highest potential. Every activity and learning experience is thoughtfully constructed to aid in the development of his/her spirituality, intellect, character, and God-given abilities.

We believe our children and families deserve the very best we have to offer, so each part of our program meets or exceeds standards set by the state of Nevada, and meets Developmentally Appropriate Practice standards as set by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC).

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### Notice of Nondiscriminatory Policy as to Students

Water of Life Lutheran School admits students of any race, color, national and ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs, and activities, generally accorded or made available to students at the school. It does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national and ethnic origin in administration of its educational policies, admissions policies, athletic, and other school-administered programs.

## ***Tuition, Hours, and Enrollment***

### ***Tuition Policy***

The Registration Fee is non-refundable, and is due upon official registration and enrollment.

Our tuition covers only the academic school year. You are not charged tuition for one week at Thanksgiving, Easter Break and two weeks for Christmas Break. There are 37 weeks of school that require tuition payments. Payments are made through our auto-debit system, Tuition Express. The weekly tuition payment will be processed according to the billing option chosen. A \$25 insufficient funds fee will be charged if your payment is denied. Credit card payments will include a 3% one time fee charged on August 1.

The following billing options are available:

- Once-a-week tuition payment on the Friday of the week prior for the following week
- Once-a-month tuition payment on the 1<sup>st</sup> of every month in 10 equal installments

A 15 minute grace period will be given for children who are picked up late. After the grace period, there will be a \$10 charge per half hour. Parents should notify the school in the event of an emergency that will result in a late pick-up.

Non-payment of tuition will result in termination of student privileges at our school. In the case of a no-notice withdrawal from our school, tuition is non-refundable and partial months will not be refunded. If a student is withdrawn by the 15th of the month, the rest of the month's tuition will be refunded. We require at least two weeks notice of intent to withdraw a student.

All accounts must be up to date to release your child's records to another school.

### ***Making Changes to Your Tuition Express Account***

Changes to your Tuition Express method of payment need to be submitted to the Front Office via a new Tuition Express Form.

Tuition information is available on the Tuition and Schedule sheet.

### ***Making Changes to Your Child's Schedule***

Changes to your child's schedule need to be submitted to the Director via a Program Change Request Form.

### ***Enrollment***

For enrollment information, please see the Director or Office Manager. Enrollment information is also available at the school website, [www.wateroflifeschool.org](http://www.wateroflifeschool.org). ALL paperwork must be submitted to the Front Office at least one week before a student's start date. A student will not be admitted to class without a complete file.

### ***Registration***

Registration fees vary and discounts are available. Please see the Front Office for details.

### ***Certified Non-Member Status***

The Certified Non-Member Status and the resulting tuition discount is granted upon completion of our "4 Key Concepts" Class for parents. Please see the Front Office for details about the class.

### Arrival and Departures

#### Drop off Time

Drop off time for classes begins at 7:50 am.

#### Arrival Procedures

The school's front door is equipped with a special lock with a key pad. Each person authorized to pick up or drop off a child will receive a unique combination that opens the door. Upon arrival students must be signed in by a parent/guardian or designated representative at the front office. *Students must then be escorted in person to the classroom.*

#### Departure Procedures

A parent/guardian or designated representative must come to the classroom door to pick up a student and must sign the student out at the front office. A student will only be released to a parent/guardian or a previously designated representative. The school office must have copies of identification for all parents/guardians and designated representatives on file.

If a parent/guardian wishes to designate a temporary representative to pick up a student, arrangements must be made to have identification on file with the school office. Anyone picking up a child even on a one-time basis must provide the front office with proper identification. This must be done before the designated pick-up time so a photo copy can be made of the identification. A note will be made on the sign-in sheet with the name of the person picking up the student. The person picking up the student must show identification before the student will be released.

A 15 minute grace period will be given for children who are picked up late. After the grace period, there will be a \$10 charge per half hour. Parents should notify the school in the event of an emergency that will result in a late pick-up.



## ***Health***

### ***When to Keep Your Child Home From School***

Per Nevada health regulations, please keep your child home if these symptoms are present:

- Fever greater than 99 degrees
- Severe sore throat
- Diarrhea or vomiting
- Excessive nasal discharge (especially if it is green or yellow)
- Unidentified or unusual rash
- Any communicable disease such as chicken pox, ringworm, or pink eye

### ***Returning to school***

Children may return to school after:

- They have been fever free for 24 hours without fever reducing medicine
- No vomiting or diarrhea for 24 hours

Returning after a communicable disease requires a note from a health care provider.

Please keep an ill child home until he/she is ready to play outside. Children who appear noticeably ill upon arrival will not be admitted to school.

### ***If a Child Becomes Sick at School***

Children who become ill at school will be isolated in the school office under the care of the Office Manager or Director. After parents/guardians are contacted, the child should be picked up within the hour.

### ***Reportable Diseases***

State regulations require us to report any communicable diseases to the Health Department. If your child contracts a communicable disease, please notify us immediately.

### ***Allergies/Health Issues***

Please report any allergies or health issues to the school by filling out the Health Information form included in your registration packet. Any changes in your child's health should be reported to the school as soon as possible.

### ***Minor Accidents and Emergency Authorization***

The school staff is certified in CPR and basic first aid. In the event of a minor accident, appropriate first aid protocols will be followed, and the accident documented in writing on our Accident Report Forms. All students are required to have a completed Emergency Contact/Emergency Treatment Authorization Form on file with the school office. In the event of an emergency, the school will immediately call local first responders, and the number on the Emergency Contact Form.

### ***Sunscreen***

Parents are encouraged to apply sunscreen to their child, if needed, before arriving at school. School staff may not apply sunscreen to any student.

## ***Medications***

If your child requires medications during the school day, a member of our staff will administer it, if an Authorization to Administer Medications is on file in the school office. Prescription medication can only be administered if it is in the original container, with the child's name, the doctor's name, and dispensing instructions on it. Over-the-counter medication can only be given with the written permission of the parent. All medications are kept in the school office. Medications requiring refrigeration will be secured in the staff refrigerator in the staff lounge.

## ***Child Abuse and Neglect/Endangerment***

School staff is required by law to immediately report any suspected abuse, neglect, or endangerment to the school Director, who will in turn notify Child Protective Services or the proper authorities. The law does not require school staff to notify parents or guardians that a report has been made to Child Protective Services.

## ***Immunizations***

For the safety of our staff and students, all students must be up-to-date on all immunizations before attending school. A current immunization record must be on file with the school office. An immunization record must also be on file with the Nevada state registry- WebIZ. You may register through your health care provider or online. Please provide the school access to this record by filling out the form in the Enrollment and Registration Packet.

## ***School Policies and Procedures***

### ***Personal Belongings***

Each child has an assigned space for outerwear, lunch boxes, extra clothes, and backpacks. Please label any personal items- ie backpack, lunchbox, thermos, jackets and coats, etc

### ***School Dress Code***

Our school day is a very active one. Parents are reminded to please take extra care to ensure children are appropriately dressed for play/learning activities and for outdoor play.

Your child's safety is very important to us! For the safety of your child, please provide appropriate footwear. We encourage tennis or athletic shoes if possible. Girls wearing dresses or skirts should wear shorts, bike shorts, or leggings underneath.

Each child must have a complete change of clothes (including underwear and shoes) available at all times at school in a resealable, labeled, plastic bag. Please ensure these remain current in terms of clothing size and are appropriate for the season.

### ***Snacks and Lunch***

A healthy morning snack is provided at a regularly scheduled time as a part of our morning routine. Children who are staying for lunch need to bring a lunch in a lunch box with an ice pack. Microwaves are not available to heat up your child's lunch. Children will have access to water as a beverage during lunch, please include a drink if desired. Good nutrition is a part of our curriculum. Please help your child put what he/she will be learning into practice by providing healthy food choices in his/her lunch.

### ***Rest Time***

State of Nevada regulations require that every preschool child who is in a facility for more than 5 hours per day must have a nap/rest period during the day. We provide cots for each child; families are asked to provide a crib sheet and small blanket. These will be sent home each day for laundering at your discretion. Your child may bring a small stuffed toy or doll to use only during rest time. These will remain in the cubbies except during rest time.

### ***Personal Toys***

Other than a small doll or stuffed toy for use during rest time, parents are asked to ensure that personal belongings and toys please remain at home. This is to avoid loss or damage at school.

### ***Birthdays and Celebrations***

Families are encouraged to share birthdays with the class by bringing a small treat. Please check with your child's teacher regarding scheduling and clear any food allergies before planning your treat. Treats must be pre-packaged or from a licensed bakery.

### ***Bathroom Policy***

We are not licensed to provide diapering service at our facility. All children who attend the school must be toilet trained and self-sufficient in the bathroom. Occasional accidents do occur; however, if accidents become too frequent, we will ask you to withdraw your child until he/she is toilet trained.

### ***Smoking***

Per Nevada law, no smoking is permitted in our school or playground area.

### ***Pest Control***

The school and the playground are routinely treated by a licensed professional service with a product that is safe for children and pets.

### ***Field Trips***

Teachers may plan an occasional field trip throughout the year. Each teacher will provide the appropriate Field Trip Form prior to the field trip; each child should have a Field Trip Form in order to participate. Children must be accompanied on a Field Trip by a parent, guardian, or other designated adult.

### ***Programs***

The students will have regular opportunities to sing both in our Worship Service and in special programs for family and friends. We look forward to sharing these special events with you, and will let you know well in advance when they will occur. Any special program will not incur additional expenses for costumes, etc.

## ***School Staff***

Our teachers have undergraduate or advanced degrees in education. Our support staff is highly experienced and well trained. Anyone who has contact with, or access to, the children has passed an extensive, official, FBI background check. All staff is required to undergo appropriate, regularly scheduled, continuing education training and classes.

## ***Fire Zone***

The circular drive in front of the church and school is a fire zone. Cars may not be left unattended; please park your car and escort your child into the school.

## ***Communication***

### ***Daily Communication***

Families are encouraged to communicate daily with your teacher about your child. Providing the teacher with background information as needed will help your teacher provide a school experience that meets your child's needs on every level.

### ***Teacher Communication***

Teachers will communicate with families through various methods as determined by each individual teacher (such as e-mails, newsletters, notes, phone calls). There will also be a newsletter from the Director to share overall school news and other items of interest to the school community in general.

### ***Conferences***

Your teacher will offer a regular parent-teacher conference twice a year to discuss your child's progress. Teachers are also available by appointment for additional meetings to discuss anything of concern to you.

### ***Additional Information***

Information is also available on the bulletin board just inside the front door of the school, on your classroom bulletin board, and on the school's website.

### ***Questions or Concerns***

Questions or concerns about your child or your child's program should be brought to the attention of your child's teacher. If there are additional questions or concerns, please feel free to bring them to the attention of the school Director.

### ***Photographs***

Photographs of children participating in school programs may be taken occasionally and may appear in newspapers, magazines, brochures, or other publicity materials. Families who do not wish their child's photograph to be taken may indicate so on the Photo Release Form.

## ***Family Involvement***

We consider families to be a great resource for our children and our school. We have an open door policy and families are invited to visit our school any time. We also encourage and appreciate your participation in the classroom. Your teacher will be more than happy to talk with you about opportunities for you to share your talents, abilities, interests, culture, and time with your child's class.

There are also opportunities to share your time, talents, and abilities with the church. Help and support are always appreciated!

## ***Emergency Response Plan***

An Emergency Response Plan is on file in the school office. In the event of an emergency, the safety of our students is our top priority. If there is an emergency situation, you will be contacted by the school staff. Please do not call the school, this may hamper the staff's ability to see to the safety of our students. The school regularly schedules emergency drills per State Fire Marshal and state and local ordinances.

## ***Management and Discipline***

Effective discipline stems from careful planning and consistency. Our staff strive to develop a positive relationship with each child and redirect unacceptable behavior. Proper Christian discipline in our school is maintained and exercised in a loving manner in keeping with the Law and Gospel. Corporal punishment as a manner of discipline will not be tolerated. Discipline will not be physically or emotionally abusive, nor will it violate any personal rights.

We are committed to providing an atmosphere that fosters trust, security, and comfort, and an environment that encourages caring and cooperative relationships. As a result, the children learn to relate to each other in positive ways. Our objective is to assist children to develop self-control, self-confidence, and ultimately self-discipline and sensitivity in their interaction with others. It is important for the children to realize what they did and how it affects others. Limits are explained to the children in a positive manner, emphasizing what to do rather than what not to do. The children are taught that using inappropriate language, or exhibiting aggressive, destructive, or violent behavior is not acceptable. The staff will use a variety of positive guidance techniques and consequences that are immediate, consistent, and logical. Teachers will communicate with parents regarding any behavior concerns. When positive discipline and guidance are not effective, a parent-teacher conference will be held to determine the need for further intervention. If the problem persists, the Director will be informed of the situation and will provide additional assistance. If the problem is still not resolved, the concern may be brought to the Board of Directors. If further intervention is unsuccessful, continued problems can be grounds for dismissal of the student from the school.



## ***Program Information***

### ***School Program Foundation***

The Preschool and Pre-K programs have at their core solid Biblical teaching and best practices in early childhood education. Our curriculum provides your child with a foundation of Bible stories that share God's love with your child, and provides for age appropriate activities in literacy, math, art, science, and social studies. Our students also participate in school-wide Chapels each week, led by our pastor.

Both the Preschool and Pre-K programs focus on the skills that your child will need the most in order to build a foundation for successful school experiences in the future, as expressed by kindergarten and first grade teachers in our community and across the country. Our school is designed to be the bridge between your home and your child's entry into Kindergarten or First Grade.

### ***Preschool Class Admission Requirements***

This class is open to children ages who are ages three and four, are toilet trained, and independent and self-sufficient in the bathroom.

### ***Preschool Class***

Our preschool class is specially designed to meet the needs of our youngest students, many of whom may be attending school for the first time. The learning opportunities in this class provide experiences for students to gain self-reliance skills, independence skills, group cooperation skills, and self-control. Your child will grow and flourish as they learn to love learning through our theme and literature-based, aged appropriate curriculum. We will provide fun activities to promote letter and number recognition, math concepts, science, social studies, and art.

## ***Pre-K Class Admission Requirements***

This class is open to children who are ages four and five, are toilet trained, and independent and self-sufficient in the bathroom.

## ***Pre-K Class***

Our Pre-K class assists your child in continuing mastery of the skills needed for successful entry into Kindergarten, such as: group-cooperation skills, communication skills, greater independence skills, and increased self-reliance skills.

Our Pre-K class utilizes a great curriculum, Get Set for School, that introduces reading and math to your child. This curriculum features engaging and enjoyable activities, using proven and research-based methods.

The Get Set for School “Readiness and Writing” and “Language and Literacy” curricula feature a format that emphasizes the joy of learning and includes:

- mastering cooperation skills
- learning how to take turns
- listening skills
- speaking skills
- vocabulary development
- letter recognition
- fine motor skill development
- age-appropriate writing skills

The math portion of Get Set for School helps children gain skills while maintaining a learning environment that follows a child’s natural curiosity and interest, including:

- number sense
- counting
- spatial awareness
- patterning
- sequencing
- problem solving
- 

In addition, our PreK program includes science and social studies topics, such as:

- Plants and animal life cycles
- Habitats
- Weather and seasons
- Health and safety
- Social skills
- Holidays

### **Music**

Our custom music curriculum focuses on the joy of singing and music appreciation, and provides an age-appropriate foundation of hymns and songs. Music time will be a great part of your child’s day, and our children will have many opportunities to sing both in the classroom and in church.

## ***Kindergarten Class***

### ***Kindergarten Admission Requirements***

The Kindergarten Class is open to students who will be age 5 by September 30.

Our Kindergarten class embodies the finest in spiritual, academic, and character development practices for our young students to help them achieve school success in first grade and beyond.

### ***Language Arts***

Our language arts curriculum is based on educational research and early learning best practices It:

- integrates speaking, listening, reading, and writing.
- solidifies phonological and phonemic awareness
- provides engaging phonics instruction
- includes fun and effective strategies for learning sight words
- leads students through the stages of emergent writing
- includes age-appropriate instruction on conventions of a sentence and spelling patterns
- introduces learners to literal and inferential reading comprehension strategy, close reading, word work and reflective thinking
- engages students and inspires a life-long love of reading
- respects diversity in individual reading readiness and preferred learning styles

### ***Mathematics***

Our math program uses a combination of the Saxon Math Curriculum and the Mindful Math Curriculum. Both curricula provide hands-on, minds-on experiences for kindergarten learners. With these curricula students build on existing math skills to develop fluency, strengthen their mathematical conceptual thinking, explore various math tools and strategies, and reach toward mastery of kindergarten standards and beyond. A great variety of lessons and practice opportunities support students' individual learning styles. Our program is research based and common-core aligned. Just as importantly, the materials are engaging and enjoyable for students to use.

Our students receive instruction in core concepts that include:

- Numbers and Operations
- Measurement
- Geometry
- Patterns, Algebra, and Functions
- Statistics, Data Analysis, and Probability
- Problem Solving
- Communication
- Mathematical Reasoning
- Connections

### ***Social Studies, Science, and Art***

Using Nevada State Academic Standards, students are provided with appropriate learning opportunities that exceed state guidelines in Social Studies, Science, and Art.



## ***Pandemic Handbook Addendum***

**Water of Life Lutheran School has adopted this plan, which utilizes information from Southern Nevada Health District (SNHD), Child Care Licensing, and the CDC to protect staff, children, and their families from the spread of COVID-19.**

The health and well-being of our staff and students are our highest priority and we will do all that we can to continue to provide the highest quality of early childhood education and care that you have come to expect from Water of Life.

We will continue to:

- Follow SNHD, Child Care Licensing, and CDC guidance for child care centers.
- Take precautions to protect students and children, faculty and staff from the spread of COVID-19.
  - Diligent handwashing
  - Social distancing between classrooms
  - Intensified cleaning and disinfecting protocols
  - Health screening and social distancing protocols at drop off and pick up as recommended. Any child with a fever of 100.4 or higher will be sent home and must be fever free for 48 hours before returning to school.
- Encourage both students and staff to stay home if they are ill.
- Cancel or reduce large events and gatherings, such as assemblies and field trips and not invite volunteers or visitors into the school when recommended.
- Consider short term closures if staff or student absenteeism impacts the ability to remain open. Short term closures may also be necessary to facilitate a public health investigation and/or cleaning if a case is diagnosed in a child or staff member.
- Maintain a relationship with the local health department and communicate with them if we have any questions or concerns about COVID-19.

### ***Procedures for a Confirmed Case of COVID-19 in our School***

- Contact and follow advice of SNHD.
- Assess risk and consider a short dismissal of school (2-5 days) to clean/disinfect/trace contacts in consultation with the local health officials.
- Communicate with parents and staff.
- We will let parents know if a positive COVID-19 case has been inside our building.
- In such circumstances, it is critical to maintain confidentiality of the student or staff member as required by law.
- Clean and disinfect thoroughly.

In the event of a quarantine of an entire classroom due to covid, services and tuition will be as follows:

1. **Kindergarten-** The Kindergarten teachers will continue to provide a curriculum that follows all the Kindergarten goals and standards that they normally do via digital means, and will expect work completed and returned as usual. In light of this, full tuition will continue to be charged to the Kindergarten parents.
2. **PreK and Preschool-** The PreK and Preschool teachers will provide videos and activities digitally to continue their curriculum. But since a big component of these programs is also hands on

learning and social interaction, half tuition will be charged these families for weeks that their child's classroom is closed. (If you would like to gift that other half of your weekly tuition back to the school, just let us know, and we will gladly accept that gift.)

3. If your child is out individually to quarantine because of exposure to covid from an outside source, you will still be charged full tuition, just as you would if your child were out with any other illness.
